



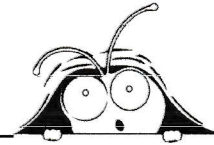
Cricut One Color Vinyl Projects


Step By Step Instructions Part 1 of 4

Cricut Design Space Uploading and Resizing


You Will Need:

- A Cricut (Yea I'll start with the obvious)
- A SVG File ... The one in this tutorial is available on our Crafty Fun Cuts Page
- Adhesive Vinyl .. Cricut makes their own and you can find it at any craft store that sells the Cricuts but it's kind of pricey. I really like the stuff we found on Amazon or sometimes you can even find it at Dollar Tree.
- Transfer Tape/Adhesive (basically clear contact paper or shelf liner.) Again Cricut makes their own, we really like the Duck EasyLiner Adhesive affordable, easy to work with.
- Something to adhere your decal to. In the case a DT Tray, but could be a mug, a board, glass jar etc.
- Weeding Tool. One came with your Cricut or you can get them at DT. (It's the plastic thing shaped like a pen with a sharp point on the end) Tweezers help too.







1. Open Cricut Design Space and Select New Project




2. This is your canvas. At the bottom of the left hand corner there is a button that says Upload. Click on that.




3. Click Upload Image




4. Click on the Browse button and find the SVG file you Unzipped from this site




5. Usually SVG files do not show a preview like a picture does. It shows as a web page. (In my case as a Microsoft Edge file, because that is my default browser. If your default browser is something else Chrome, Explorer, etc. it will show as that



6. Click on the image you want and click open. This will bring it to a preview screen at this point you can name or tag your image. Then click Upload



7. Click on the image you just uploaded and click Add To Canvas



8. You can resize by clicking on the image and using the arrows at the bottom right hand corner and dragging it in and out. The pic will maintain it's shape because height and width will resize together. The grid on the sides will help you determine how big your design is

9. The other way to resize is to type in either the width or height of what you want. In this case I wanted the gnome to be 5 1/2 inches, I typed 5.5 ENTER into the height H box.
